

Session 5.2 - Infections associated OMAS Do we need to approach differently- Naveen Sankhyan

Abstract:

While OMAS is a prototype of a childhood paraneoplastic neurological syndrome, not all OMAS cases are tumor-associated. Some children develop OMAS as a post-infectious phenomenon, and even more rarely, in association with acute viral and bacterial infections. In this talk, the presenter will discuss the occurrence of OMAS in the setting of various infections, reviewing the available literature. Emphasis will be placed on the management of infection-associated OMAS and how it might differ from other forms. The goal is to provide a comprehensive overview of OMAS related to infections and discuss effective management strategies.
